





Someone once described my work as "Tom Thompson on uppers" to which I replied Thank you very much for such a nice compliment. Working primarily in oil, with a minor in soft pastel, my current work is a thrilling (to

me) combination of carefully drawn images, underpinned, then overlaid with colour, and a splitting of large areas of water, sky or land, into geometric abstraction. I start with an idea of my image. Then underpaint. Next, is colour. I have found working spontaneously in the moment with the next layers of colour, is an exciting gift. My imagery is mostly landscape, but I do love the figure and work also with the figure in natural environs, usually depicting the human figure in unusual positions and defying perspectives. A pure palette of vibrant colour doesn't hurt. In my teaching life, I specialize in soft pastel, life drawing, and plein air painting workshops. Working en plein air, I am at home in the woods and in nature. For the past thirty years, I have been a workshop instructor, having set up my own studio, in Ottawa, Canada. In 2017, I said goodbye to my home in the Ottawa valley and moved to the Georgian bay region of Ontario, north of Toronto. In 2009, I published my first book, A Time to dance. In 2017, I was named Master pastellist-EM by the Pastel Artist of Canada. My work has been shown in many National and International Art Exhibitions, including the Pastel Society of America (National Arts Club, NYC), The Pastel Artists of Canada (Toronto, Etobicoke, Vancouver and many other locations), and the Pastel Society of Eastern Canada, which exhibits out of Montreal. I've also exhibited in commercial galleries, and hosted shows at my studio gallery.

Derek attended Sheridan College of Applied Arts and Technology in Oakville, Ontario and graduated at the top of his class from the Technical & Scientific Illustration Program, whan a ward for Artistic Excellence. After graduation, his career led him to free-lance illustration where he specialized in architectural rendering. Attention to detail became Derek's commercial trademark, a trademark that would find it's way into his wildlife art. Gaining international recognition, Derek's transition to full time nature artist came about in 1995. Through the years Derek's work has been selected to endorse several conservation efforts such as the Canadian Conservation Fund, Timber Wolf Alliance, Ducks Unlimited and the Children's Wish Foundation. Derek is a avid supporter of conservation groups and efforts and a signature member of Artist For Conservation. In both 2007 and 2011 Derek was named the National Artist Of the Year by Ducks Unlimited and The 2012 Artist Of the Year by Oro-Medonte Chamber of Commerce. In the summer of 2012 Derek traveled with WREAF, a group sponsored by the National Museum of History in the Smithsonian to Alaska as a field painting reference trip for a show scheduled in the Museum in 2016-17.

It has been another busy year and Arnold has been working hard on some very exciting woods obtained from Ontarios majestic forests. Burls were sourced locally from the Simooe County region while others were obtained

from northern Ontario or the Carolinian forests in southern Ontario. Burls, a rarity, are the most challenging and exciting pieces to work on but are also the most rewarding. This year's batch has set the bar quite high, the best seen in a long time. During the winter months, there were numerous road trips to loggers throughout Ontario in search of black walnut, hickory, elm, black cherry, ambrosia maple, and butternut logs. Arnold is also a proud provincial "Ontario Wood" program member and has won multiple awards for his work. He carefully and selectively looks for woods with inner beauty and diverse grain patterns, prospecting for hidden treasures. Natural edge creations are sought after and collected for their rustic and irregular appearance. Clean-edged wood turnings are also made in the traditional form. No matter your style choice, each will show the extraordinary features attributed to the various species available in Ontario. Each wood turning begins from green wet wood, is hollowed into a rough form, and left to air dry for up to one year depending on the species. When this form dries and stabilizes, Arnold then reworks and fine-tunes the shape of the bowl into a unique and creative work of art. Lastly, a food-safe finish is applied, making the items functional and/or decorative. Arnold's home studio is located at 16 Wells Crescent in Barrie and is available by appointment.

Charlotte Williams creates her bold landscapes using imagery captured within memories, scenes colourfully displayed and reflections from past travels. Born in England, Charlotte spent some of her childhood in Nigeria

before returning to the UK and to Wales. After her studies, she spent many years in Brazil before moving to Canada where she now resides. Her travels and considerable experiences have helped inspire the artist today. The Welsh part of Charlotte's heritage and her current Canadian life bring together recollections of verdant and pastoral surroundings, which feature prominently in her atmospheric landscapes. 'I use poetry for my titles to create a certain resonance and bring a sense of nostalgia to each image.' Working with watercolours and acrylics, inspiration is further gained through poetry and an intense attention to detail. Her artwork produces a feeling from a favourite memory or an image reflected from reminiscence. With candid brushstrokes and a nod to past and present travels, Charlotte evokes a sense of nostalgia which resonates beyond her vibrant landscape imagery. Charlotte's work brings forth images on side roads, along forgotten country paths and comforting scenic views to give us a sense of reassurance, and a fond remembrance of similar views hidden away but longing to be drawn from our own cherished past. 2019 has been a very busy year with great showings at the Artist Project in Toronto, the Gordon Harrison Gallery in Ottawa, and the Lorimer Galleries in Ottawa and Charlottetown to mention a few. The summer has meant participation at the Riverdale Artwalk in Toronto, the Rosedale Art Fair and the Coldwater Tour. Later in the year Charlotte will be showing at the One of a Kind Christmas Show where she showed her work for the first time in 2018 with great success.

Jan's combination of growing up in Prague during his youth and living in various parts of Canada has given him an appreciation of European architecture and street scenes, along with the many panoramic landscapes of Georgian Bay and the Canadian Rockies. Color, shapes, and the dance of light serve to delight me with roads, farms, fields, small towns, and of course water. I am an impressionist artist. When I paint I try to capture the spirit of time and place rather than the reality, I find my inspiration in the natural beauty of Ontario. It is a rugged, beautiful province. Recently I have been happily

painting flowers. It has been a very uplifting experience creating florals that are filled with movement and colour. I create movement and texture in all of my painting, be it a landscape or a floral, by using different brush strokes. To capture wind I will swipe a dry brush over the painting image. It is most interesting to do when the painting is still a bit wet. I often use a damp cloth to wipe back the colours I have applied. This creates a softer texture and reduces the intensity of the colour. At another time I will apply transparent layers of paint using a large brush to soften areas of the painting, perhaps a mist. I also build up luminous colour by applying transparent glazes of colour. To lead the viewer's eye to the centre of interest in the painting I apply the paint in sharper edges with more contrasting colour in that area. In addition to creating movement and texture it is my exploration of colour that engages me as I paint. Mixing primary colours creates the incredible range of rich colours in my paintings that visitors to my studio have always enjoyed. While shaping the bowl he also allows the wood to naturally create its own unique look. Sometimes people will bring him wood from their family property and ask him to make an heirloom bowl that can be passed down in the family. Much of Xavier's work is made with black wahrut, butternut, maple, or spalted maple and recently working with burls. His woodturned pieces bring out the natural wood grain and the shapes are sculptural in form. Xavier has been creating works of art for over 30 years, working with various paints, drawing tools, digital images, graphic design and music videos. Also working in 3D, he has worked with body paint, clay, stone, metal, and wood, among other media. He was involved in all three Somniatis Wearable Art Shows in Orillia, and also the Call 83 Truth and Reconciliation art shows, currently on display at St. Paul's Orillia. 
